Costs incurred by a third party as a result of a transaction which the third party is not a part of.

Societal costs from transportation are such costs

Accidents, pollution, road congestion, climate, habitat damage, etc.










External costs (societal costs from transport)








External costs by category












External cost impact by zero-emission
